
#### Indian Gentleman's Ride At Aerocity

This in house bottling plant

reduces the carbon footprint associated with transportation and disposal of plastic bottles. The hotel educates guests about its sustainable practices and encourages responsible consumption. 

Foundation's Empowering Initiatives

The Foundation works with the vision 'To make sustainable impact on the human development of under-served communities through initiatives in education, health and livelihoods'

nclusive growth is at the core of GMR Group and since inception there has been a strong focus on corporate sustainability with profit, people and planet at the triple bottom line of the business. GMR Group's charitable and philanthropic activities started in 1991. As the group grew and emerged as one of the leading infrastructure companies in the country, it formed a separate institution called GMR Varalakshmi Foundation (GMRVF) for undertaking CSR activities on a significant scale. Considering that education, health and livelihoods are the key components that ensure the wellbeing of the communities, the Foundation focuses on these thrust areas. GMRVF is currently working in 17 locations across the country wherever it has business operations.

Recognising the need for access to good quality education and healthcare in rural and remote locations, GMRVF established educational institutions of excellence at Rajam, Andhra Pradesh – GMR Institute of Technology and SGCSR College – that provide higher education opportunities to the local students. A 200-bed multi-specialty hospital was also built at Rajam which provides affordable quality healthcare services in this remote location.

Considering the industry's need for skilled manpower and also to leverage the huge demographic dividend of the country, GMRVF has been training youth in various industry-relevant skills, in line with Skill India Mission of GOI, in its 15 skill training centres across the country, including the three state-of-the-art training centres in three airport locations namely Delhi, Hyderabad and Goa. The main USP of skilling by GMRVF is the industry-partnered model so that the training becomes very relevant

ni



to the industry requirements. Voltas, Schneider, Volvo, Gyproc-Saint Gobian are some of the eminent industry partners GMRVF has in the area of skill training. All trainings are offered without any fees and Delhi and Hyderabad centres also offer free boarding and lodging during the training period.

Women empowerment is another important focus of the Foundation and towards this Foundation works with women groups and encourages them to produce different products for income generation which are marketed through EMPOWER (Enabling Marketing of Products of Women Entrepreneurs) initiative. Eco-friendly jute and handmade paper products, cloth bags etc. made by the women are marketed through the shop at the Hyderabad Airport, office sales, setting up exhibitions, bulk

orders etc. A Millet Processing Unit was also set up in Hyderabad recently which is also providing livelihood opportunity for underprivileged women. Overall, about 100 women are being supported under this initiative.

In Delhi, about 600 Covid-affected families, including Covid widows, were supported with push carts to initiate income generation activities under the Project SMILE (Supporting Marginalised Individuals through Livelihoods and Empowerment).

GMRVF believes that every child should be engaged in quality learning experience and towards this it works with over 7,000 underprivileged students studying in government schools at the three airport locations. Providing Vidya Volunteers to address the gap in teacher-student ratio, teaching and learning material, infrastructure support like toilets, additional classrooms, drinking water facility, conducting after school classes are some of the interventions in this area.

Digital learning is also being actively promoted through eeducation centres, Smart classrooms, STEM labs, World on Wheels bus etc.

The Foundation also implements a unique scheme called Gifted Children under which 283 under-privileged children are being sponsored for education from 1st standard till their first job since last 20 years with a few batches already completing their education and settled in good jobs.

Considering the healthcare and wellbeing needs of the growing elderly population, the Foundation is running four Mobile Medical Units in all three airport locations and multi-activity centre that provide multiple health services to the elderly at Delhi. The Foundation also strives towards providing preventive and curative healthcare to the most vulnerable communities through its evening clinics, regular health camps and awareness programs. Five nutrition centres are run at Delhi and Hyderabad that provide nutrition supplements, ante and post-natal care to the pregnant and lactating women.

While GMR Group is contributing to the development of the nation by building world class infrastructure, GMR Varalakshmi

Foundation, through its humble efforts, is ensuring that the fruits of development reach out to the most under-served.



Delhi has something for everyone. Whether you are a nature lover or theatre buff, you will find much to satiate your taste


inters bring out the best in Delhi, and locals and tourists come out of the air-conditioned confines to explore the city. Irrespective of your tastes and inclination, there is something for everyone in this city. Follow any trail, and you will never be disappointed.

Starting with Aerocity, that has lush green and well-maintained green space at The Square, you can spend hours soaking in the sun, admiring the

greenery and chirping of birds. Or you stroll along the well-maintained streets admiring the modernist architecture, or enjoy a beverage at an outdoor seating arrangement at a restaurant or a hotel lawn. Step out of Aerocity to experience the city which has a rich historical legacy and greenery that are the envy of any other city, cultural spaces, food trail, and festive trail.

Heritage trail: Pick up a map of monuments of Delhi from a tourism office





Nature trail: The lushness of the city – both its forest areas and parks as well as its avenues leave the travellers spell-bound. Both the British and the post-independent planners had the vision and foresight to leave large tracts for natural vegetation and to plant native fruit-bearing trees on major roads. The northern and the southern ridges, the Lodhi Gardens and the Deer Park that also spring heritage surprises at every















nook and corner with pristine vegetation hugging the monuments, Nehru Park, and other small and large gardens, making Delhi mesmerisingly beautiful. To add to that are the banks of Yamuna where you can observe the winter migratory birds.

Art and culture trail: Winters are also the months when the Delhi revs up its art act. The theatre district of National School of Drama, Shri Ram Centre for Performing Arts, Kamani Auditorium, Triveni Kala Sangam and Little Theatre Group at Mandi House, India Habitat Centre and India International Centre are the prominent spots where much of the theatre action happens. Coupled with that are the numerous art galleries, alongside the National Gallery of Modern Art that showcase the best of fine arts.

Food trail: Head to any locality – markets big or small – and you will get the taste of India. Winters are the month when you can enjoy the country-wide cuisine in outdoors. From littichokha of Bihar and momos of north-eastern states to bhel poori, pao bhaji, chhole-bhature, South Indian fare and everything else that

qualifies as fast food of India, is to be had in markets like Connaught Place, Bengali Barket, Green Park, Sarojini Nagar, Lajpat Nagar, and right within the Food Court of Aerocity.

During the festive season starting with Diwali, extending to Christmas celebrations, several bazaars spring up in prominent market spaces, open areas of malls and temple precincts selling quality apparel, jewellery, décor, gifting items, and other lifestyle products, besides eatables.

Festive + religious trail: Hanuman Mandir, Birla Mandir, temples in Chhattarpur, Iskon temple, Gurudwara Bangla Saheb, Sis Ganj Saheb, Digambar Jain Mandir, St James Church and Jama Masjid are some must-visit spots for those on spiritual or religious quest.

# Take The **Yellow Line To** Delhi's Heart

Explore the rich textures of Delhi, with all its beauty and diversity on the Yellow Line of Delhi Metro

elhi, a city known for its history, nuanced culture and notorious street food is an amalgamation of joy, chaos and an unlimited series of sporadic events all happening at the same time. It is a city of great significance, both in a geopolitical as well as a cultural sense. One of the cornerstones of Delhi's soul is its prestigious Metro. Not only does it hold great significance in the lives of Delhiites, one could even argue that it is the very driving force behind it. The yellow line, in particular is arguably the busiest metro line in the city. Some might make a case for the blue line, but we'll save that debate for another day.

The yellow line can easily be described as the working man's metro line. The stretch, from Samayour Badli to Millenium city centre, is travelled by over a million people every single day. However, there's something else that this metro is known for and that is connecting some of the most iconic places in Delhi's landscape. Let's dive into some of these


#### Kashmere Gate - Kashmere Gate **Metro Station**

The scene of gruesome fighting between the colonial and Indian forces during the Revolt of 1857, this northern gate that guarded the walled city during the Mughal rule was at the receiving end of heavy shelling. Today, this gate, otherwise secluded from the hustle of the adjoining Inter State Bus Terminal and the market area, receives occasional groups of history enthusiasts and regular groups of locals looking for a place to rest or play. Some century-old shops and residential quarters nearby are pale shadow of what the happening quarters of Delhi would have been like in the late 19th and early 20th century.

#### Hudson Lane - Vishwavidyalaya **Metro Station**

This food hub in the North Campus of Delhi University has some popular eateries where a range of fast food and snacking choices is served. You can club your trip to Hudson Lane with a stroll in the campus area where some of the leading colleges of the Delhi University are located.





#### **Red Fort - Chandni Chowk Metro Station**

Red Fort does not need any introduction. This titanic red stone fort was built in 1638 by then Mughal emperor Shah Jahan. The fort spanning across 125 acres is also a major attraction during Independence Day when the prime minister addresses the nation. Apart from that, it has become a symbol of national pride that is loaded with history. Also called the Lal Qila, this is one of the most iconic monuments in the capital city of Delhi and the red coloured sandstone used in its construction is the reason behind it. The Red Fort comprises multiple palaces, entertainment halls, baths and indoor canals, geometrical gardens and even a mosque that was used by the emperor himself.

#### Jama Masjid - Chawri Bazaar Metro Station

Delhi's most iconic structures. Built by Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan, Jama Masjid used to serve as the imperial mosque for Mughal emperors until the sultanate's fall in 1857 Spanning across an area of 325 square feet, Jama Masjid holds huge historical significance Surrounded by the

Undergoing massive transformation, first with the coming up of the War Memorial and the shifting of the Amar Jawan Jyoti to these premises, and the installation of Subhash Chandra Bose's statue and now with the coming up of Prime Minister's Residence and other construction projects all around, India Gate remains a popular tourist spot. Tourists flock to it throughout the year, braving the summers and winters alike.

#### Safdarjung ka Maqbara – Jor Bagh Metro Station

Safdarjung ka Maqbara or Safdarjung's Tomb, as the name suggests, is the tomb of Safdarjung who served as the Viceroy of Awadh under the rule of then Mughal emperor Mohammed Shah.

It was built by Nawab Shujaud Daula, Safdarjung's son, in memory of his father. It is the last garden tomb that displays the archetype architecture seen during the Mughal era. This iconic piece of Delhi's history dates back to the 18th century. Interestingly, it is not just the monument that attracts tourists but it is also the surrounding nature that is an absolute sight to behold.

#### **Lodi Gardens – Jor Bagh Metro Station**

Similar to the above mentioned Safdurjung's Tomb, Lodhi Gardens is also an immaculate concoction of nature and history. As it can clearly be inferred by the name, Lodhi Gardens is essentially home to the tombs of members of the Lodhi dynasty. In winters, this place also hosts a large number of migratory birds.

#### Hazrat Nizamuddin Dargah – Jor Bagh Metro Station

Coming out of the Jor Bagh metro station and approaching the



Hazrat Nizammuddin Dargah might give you flashbacks from 2011's hit flick, Rockstar. Apart from being the set for kunfavakun. Hazrat Nizamuddin is also a key piece of the collage of Delhi's heritage. #### Hauz Khas Village - Hauz Khas Metro Sta-

It still is a place known for some of Delhi's fantastic restaurants and it has also become a place

#### Dilli Haat – Dilli Haat Metro Station

#### Aravali Biodiversity Park - Guru Dronacharya Metro

find a plush and well-constructed biodiversity park that is just perfect for walking around, cycling, jogging or simply experiencing the sunset while taking a stroll. Originally a sand mine, the park, with the efforts of citizens, an NGO called IAmGurgaon and ecologist Vijay Dhasmana, was transformed into a place that is today home to numerous species of vegetation. It is also the country's first OECM site (other effective area-based conservation measures). For those who do not know OECMs are areas that aim to achieve long-term in-situ conservation of biodiversity but are not categorically protected areas.

#### Garden of Five Senses and Champa Gali - Saket Metro Station

This lush garden that came up 20 years ago, in 2003, combines elements of nature including water channels and fountains with sculptures and futuristic designs and speaks to - as the name suggests - all our five senses. Touch, smell, sight, sound, and taste are all evoked by a combination of colour and aroma, texture and form. Close by, in the back lanes of Saket, is a picturesque called Champa Gali with boutique setups - garments, knick-knacks, gift shops, eateries and wall art-with cool quotient that especially appeals to Gen Zs and Millennials.

The significance of the Yellow Line in Delhiite's lives is, needless to say, huge. Imagine, if you will, that surreal feeling when you're on your way to work in the Delhi Metro and you get to witness the Qutb Minar for a brief second as you approach Chhatarpur Metro Station. You're essentially witnessing a great piece of heritage and culture of one of the world's most popular cities and you do not even realise it. Metro is the very soul of the city that moves around helping people reach their destination on a daily basis. It is also a means for people to explore the city landscape in one of its rawest forms. That feeling of standing shoulder to shoulder in a crowded morning metro and hopping from station to station to explore Delhi's cultural and historical hotspots is a feeling that is best experienced rather than explained.

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




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# "Delhi Is Very Deep, With Multiple Layers"

**Nidhi Bansal,** CEO, India City Walks, describes the ethos of Delhi, and how best to explore the city



orn and Chandigarh and educated in Aurangabad, Nidhi Bansal started her career in hospitality industry and subsequently IT/ITES industry, before venturing into heritage walks. Under the umbrella of India City Walks, she has developed Delhi Walks®, Dastan E Delhi® and India Heritage Walks, besides other programmes. In an interview to Aerocity Live, she shares what made her switch over from a corporate career, what attracted her to Delhi's heritage and culture in the first place, and how visitors to Delhi can best discover the hidden gems of the city. Excerpts:

#### How did you get interested in heritage walks?

I do not come from history background but I was always interested in experiences. I worked in hospitality for 10 years and then worked in an IT/ITES organisation for about 8 years. In my 18 years in the corporate world, I focussed on delivering best

experiences. The idea to start heritage walks was my partner's (Sachin Bansal), a true Delhiite. Both of us were doing really well in our corporate jobs. I initially questioned the idea. But on a tour to Chicago, I spent two hours at a lake, and I realised that if I could spend two hours there listening to stories, in our country there is a story in every 200 metres. But nobody is telling those stories. That got me interested.

#### What is it about Delhi that fascinates you?

Delhi is very deep. It has multiple layers. It's like peeling an onion. As you peel it you discover something new – be it food or architecture or history. And Delhi is developing even today, with newer Metro lines, and landmarks like Akshardham.

Since you have lived in other cities, what is your take on the competitive spirit like Mumbai vs Delhi,



#### Kolkata vs Delhi, especially in terms of food? How do you take to specific cultural nuances of various cities?

I grew up in Maharashtra, and my first job was in Mumbai. So, I understand that rivalry more than most people. When it comes to any city, it's about exploring the city's soul. The beauty of our country is that every city has something very distinctive to offer. Both Mumbai and Delhi hold their own beauty.

#### With what expectation do visitors come to Delhi, and what is it that they are looking at?

A decade ago, visitors came to India to visit the Golden Triangle of Delhi-Agra-Jaipur. They would spend a day in Delhi and see the most prominent spots. But there has been a change over a period of time. International visitors are interested in different elements of the country or a city. India is no more one-dimensional. It is multifaceted and it is now known to the world. Different people come for unique interests too. So, there are people who are interested in food even if it may not suit their palette. There are people who come for specific genres of art or architecture; heritage and history. Interestingly, festivals have become a major attraction, including Independence Day and Republic Day. The visitors are very educated and aware, and want to know the unknown, not readily available experiences.

#### Which are your favourite spots in Delhi?

My first walk was at Mehrauli Archeological Park. It is one of my favourites. The tranquility of that place has always captivated me.

Having said that, I love the chaos of Old Delhi (where the office of India City Walks is located). It has different shades. It offers a different experience in the morning, and if you come in the afternoon or evening it is different. And it looks like a chaotic place but it is not. It moves. Nothing stands still in this place.

#### Besides the walks what other products have you developed?

We have cultural and heritage events, story-telling sessions, cultural orientation for employees of organisations, programmes for students, and for people working in embassies, who are posted for two years. We also have rickshaw tours which are well-equipped with provisions and have an city explorer® accompanying you.

# What would be your advice for someone coming to Delhi and staying in Aerocity, and what are the spots, or walks around Aerocity that you would recommend?

Aerocity has come up really well and one of the biggest boons for Aerocity is the Metro. And now you can reach from Aerocity to Dwarka in 15 minutes. Distance is irrelevant now and nothing is far in Delhi. And those staying in Aerocity can easily travel to Connaught Place and also see India Gate, Rashtrapati Bhavan, in a short timeframe. They should definitely see Humayun's Tomb, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. If they are a little more adventurous, they can come to Old Delhi for its food.





# Bangla Sahib Gurudwara

khism is not only a religion but also sets forth ideal principles to live a selfless life, and Bangla Sahib Gurudwara is the epitome of the same generosity and selfless service that Sikhism teaches. This Sikh temple was built in 1783 by Sikh General Bhagel Singh to commemorate the visit of Guru Hari Krishan in 1664.

As per the history of Sikhism, when Guru Hari Krishan visited the place, the population was reeling under the outbreak of diseases. The Guru helped the sufferers by providing them the fresh water from wells that healed the disease of many. The present-day Gurudwara Bangla Sahib was the bungalow of Raja Jai Singh and the same place where Guru Hari Krishan stayed. The sarovar on the premise of Gurudwara Bangla Sahib was built by Raja Jai Singh as a small tank over the water of a well and is still considered to have healing power for every devotee.

The main dome of the gurudwara, carved out from lustrous white marble, is of gold leaf. Apart from the main shrine, the gurudwara has several sections that are dedicated to different purposes; langar (community kitchen), a charitable hospital, a parking space, a higher secondary school and also to waiting room for visitors as yatriniwas where they can rest and relax.

Gurudwara Bangla Sahib is one of the main and most visited places in New Delhi by tourists as well as by locals. Every weekend, the Sikh temple witnesses the coming of lakhs of devotees. It is also known for its welfare services to the people, and going to start a cancer screening facility in its clinic soon.

Another example of the gurudwara's selfless service is its mega community kitchen that runs 24/7, 365 days a year and feeds over 35,000 people every day.

During festivals like Baisakhi, Prakash Utsav and Guru Purab the gurudwara shimmers with light, colour and faith of lakhs of disciples irrespective of their caste, creed and religion. Gurudwara Bangla Sahib truly practises the motto 'Seva Parmo Dharma' which means 'service to humanity is the highest religion'

## Birla Mandir, New Delhi

#### A temple that has seen history closely

irla Mandir, also known as Lakshminaravan Temple, is the first temple in the chain of Birla Temples present in different cities across India. The construction of Birla Mandir started in 1933 under the aegis of Jugal Kishore Birla, and the foundation stone of the temple was laid by Jat Maharai Udaybhan Singh. The construction was completed in 1939. Mahatma Gandhi who inaugurated the temple, visualised it to be a temple that would not restrict humans on the basis of caste and creed.

There are a total of 14 Birla temples built across India. Apart from Delhi, there are Birla Mandirs in Patna, Jaipur, Bhopal, Varanasi, Hyderabad and Kolkata, among other cities.

Birla Mandir in Delhi is a must-visit spot for tourists and

devotees alike. Especially during the festive occasions of Janmashtami and Diwali, the temple is filled up with lakhs of devotees and visitors.

The temple is spread over an area of 7.5 acres approximately, with a built-up area is 0.52 acres. The temple was built with stones brought from Agra. Makarana and Kota while the idols are built with marble brought from Jaipur. Built in Nagar style of architecture, and painted in yellow and red stone colour, the temple consists of three shikharas. The walls are adorned with verses of Bhagvad Geeta.

Apart from the main shrine of Lakshmi and Naravana, the temple also consists of the little shrine of Ganesha, Hanuman, Shiva and Buddha. The life journey of Gautama Buddha is also

depicted on the walls.

Architect of the temple. Sris Chandra Banerjee, is known to have given nationalistic direction to buildings of the time, along with element modernity to them.

Situated in the Birla Mandir has witnessed several significant events Indian modern history and witnessed socio-religious transformation of India. with shrines, the temple has is also embellished with a large garden, fountain and nationalistic sculptures of Shivaji and Chandra Gupta Maurya.

## St James Church

#### The oldest church in Delhi

signifies faith and belief in the supreme authority. During the British rule in India, St James was the official church of the British Viceroy of India in Delhi, India. Located in Kashmiri Gate. St James Church had its origins in the miraculous experience of James Skinner (a professional soldier) who was left wounded in one of his battles without food and water for 48 hours. He prayed for his safety to god in return of promise to build a chapel for god. Instantly, as an answer to his prayers, downtrodden woman appeared and helped him out and saved his life.

Later on, Skinner built a chapel to keep his promise to god which cost him nearly Rs 90.000 in that time

It is the oldest and first church in Delhi that has been the stage of historical events in itself. The main dome of the structure, painted with a dim yellow colour and standing on three porticoed porches, has the sign of a cross (principal & sacred symbol of Christianity).

On the inside, the church is huge and aesthetic and follows the original European Christian architecture style. There is one painting 'The Prodigal Son' which is an original work of Pompeo Batoni that adorned the Church premise.

The same premises also consist of many tombstones, including



those of James Skinner, Thomas Metcalf and William Fraser.

Historically, St James Church witnessed the most significant event of the freedom movement in 1857 when it suffered damages too. In 2015, the church authority initiated the conservation plan which finally started in July 2022 due to the pandemic.

Recently, in the month of August, the oldest church of the capital was renovated and opened for the public again. The restored church is now one of the most visited spots in Delhi for tourists and visitors. On Christmas every year, the church witnesses a huge crowd of believers, prayers and celebration.




A Millet Maestro

# Great **Assortment** Of Coffee **And Food Items**

Though wanting in seating and sockets for charging points, Blue Tokai at Aerocity scores high on what matters most – F&B

rom the moment you enter Blue Tokai to the moment you get up and leave, you will be in a constant state of calm. It might be just a 'coffee house' thing but what I know for sure is that it is definitely something that you will feel deeply. It is not the music, I can tell that for sure. While other popular coffee houses go for something like jazz or instrumental, Blue Tokai Aerocity is jamming on indie music.

I've been to Blue Tokai establishments in the past and this one was not different. The ambience, the music and even the seating arrangements fell in line with the brand's language. The seating, however, is limited and that did seem to be something that could make your visit to this particular Blue Tokai outlet a bit tedious depending on the time of the day you're visiting.

Another thing that concerned me gravely was the availability of power sockets. Being a working professional, I always look for spots where I can have a good cup of coffee and at the same time get some work done. All of a sudden, there is this symbiotic relationship between coffee houses and working professionals that became a norm before anyone even realised it. Blue Tokai Aerocity did not disappoint in this regard. The number of charging points could use an upgrade, though.











set, the laptop was out and I was ready to take on anything that menu had to offer. The first beverage I tried was the Iced Viet-

namese coffee. Vietnamese coffee is essentially a concoction of strong coffee, sweet condensed milk and lot of ice. It's as simple as that. I have to say there are plenty of coffee places in Delhi NCR that serve a top notch Iced Vietnamese and this one easily secures its place among the best ones.

Next up, served with a scoop of vanilla ice cream and a shot espresso, was the Affogato. Now, the thing about Affogatos is that they are part coffee and part ice cream (ideally a scoop of vanilla) and despite this strict definition, coffee houses like to play it lose. They blur the lines and make their own versions of this beverage cum dessert. Although I did find myself wanting more coffee to actually drown the scoop of ice cream completely. I liked how the two completely different flavours collided at first and then just fused together to form something so delicious that explaining it won't do it justice.

This was followed by a few drinks, namely, the Flat White and the Iced Pour Over. The former is a combination of espresso with steamed milk often characterised by a velvety consistency commonly termed as microfoam. What makes it different from a latte is its higher espresso to milk proportion and a much thinner layer of microfoam than seen in a cappuccino. The latter, on the other hand, is hands down one of the best coffee beverages ever created. The Iced Pour Over is a hidden gem that introduces you to the hidden nuances of coffee. It is a very simple beverage to make and perhaps that is what makes it so darn impressive.

Apart from beverages, Blue Tokai also has a great assortment of food items that are made in real time. Some Blue Tokai outlets also sell pasta. The one in GMR Aerocity, however, does not. The food here is exceptionally good and this is not hyperbole. It is genuinely great on all fronts, be it texture, flavour and freshness.







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of fruits and vegetables are presented as prasad in this puja. Banana, sugarcane and daabnimbu are the most important of



Gurupurab: The most significant festival of the Sikhs, it's commemorated, to begin with, by early morning Satsangs. Ladies join the early morning 'prabhat pheris' (morning processions in the neighbourhood streets), gently humming songs on the tune of manjiras, and families join in in recital of Guru Granth Sahib in the gurudwaras. Gurudwara Bangla Sahib, Sisganj, Damdama Sahib and a few other big gurudwaras get wonderfully lit up and buzz with activity during these days. Visitors are served the prasad (sooji halwa called karra prasad) that is utterly delicious.





Food fare: The tradition of serving langar, a communal meal, dates to the time of Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Gurupurab marks the day when the entire community comes together to contribute in any way they can. This celebration's culinary offerings go beyond the ordinary, encompassing not just daal, chapati, and rice but a wide array of street foods that you can imagine. From aloo tikki, dahi bhalla, ice cream, and bread pakoda to samosa, chhole bhature, rajma rice, chhole rice, kadi rice, pav bhaji, chowmein,



Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who inaugurated YashoBhoomi, also inaugurated the extension of Airport Metro Express Line to Sector 25 of Dwarkathat will connect the convention centre to the airport.

On the occasion, he said, "This is a wonderful centre to showcase the future of India. It is located close to the Airport and connected through the Metro for anyone to visit. Direct connectivity of the centre with metro makes it easier for anyone to commute and reach the centre from any part of the city."
